In 2024 the emphasis for myself and the church was SADBATH. REST. We accomplished this through a pastoral sabbatical and also a congregational focus on what matters. We got back to the basics and caught our breath. In a symbolic way, by the end of the year our TWO services became ONE. I describe this to colleagues as doing less to accomplish more. We pooled resources. We took the burden of ministry and began sharing it as opposed to spreading ourselves thin. And I believe, wholeheartedly, that as we begin 2025 we are in a better place because of it. At the very least, I can tell you that I am better because of the SABBATH REST of 2024.

This year, my pastoral emphasis and the message I hope our church will adopt is one of FORGIVENESS.

Some of the folks I've shared this message with insist that I mean GRACE. In a sense and a matter of speaking, I do. But really what I mean by FORGIVENESS is FORGIVENESS. See GRACE for many is leeway or freedom or a get out of jail free card (for others it is what you say before dinner). What I hope to stress this year is more than that. I mean letting go of resentment. I mean acknowledging our frailty and humanity. I mean accepting that we ALL make mistakes. I mean reconciliation.

I sincerely believe that our best path forwards this year as a congregation and a people (and a country?) is the path of FORGIVENESS. See, without forgiveness we have no hope. Without FORGIVENESS there is no hope.

My fear is that we are all walking around with grudges against our neighbors and regrets from ourselves. I worry that we carry too many assumptions and accusations without enough understanding and empathy. I really believe that the practice of FORGIVENESS might be exactly what we all need. You're going to hear me talk about it, so begin thinking about it. How **might FORGIVENESS change your life?** As we contemplate these heavy matters, we do so knowing that in God's eyes the FORGIVENESS is already complete.
