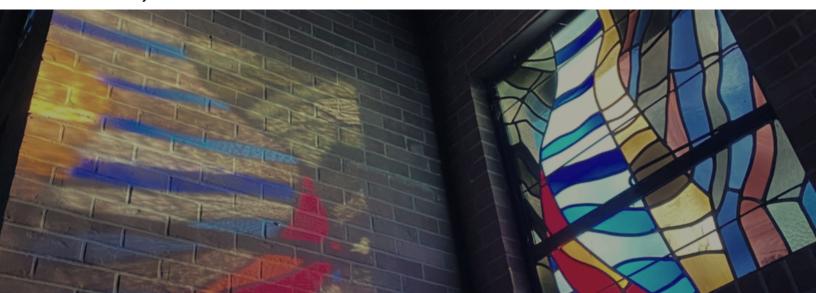

In 2025 we were able to continue to build up our youth ministry. Alex Dominique has been an asset to our program as our Youth Director. The youth group (grades 5+) meets regularly throughout the year. In June we were able to host the WNY Lutheran Youth field day in the OMC. Three weeks of day camp this summer in the OMC provided little ones a chance to experience camp and gave high school students the chance to serve as Junior Counselors. In the fall, we hosted a regional Lutheran Youth flag football event (again, at the OMC).

In the summer, youth were encouraged to attend Lake Chautauqua Lutheran Center. This summer we had kids at camp every week of the season. In the spring, Pastor Hannon, Paul Swanson, Tom Brunner, and Rick Bosch spent 2 days at LCLC building adventure course elements for the camp.

Moving forward, Alex's hours will be increased in 2026 and we hope to continue to build on this important ministry.

Sunday School occurs after a children's sermon during worship. Attendance has increased. The current model seems to be working for this chapter of our congregation's life. A Christmas Pageant is held yearly led by the SS kids. Teachers are always needed. A signup is located across from the nursery.

- We send volunteers to Friends of Night People once a month. In addition to providing the labor we also purchase and provide the food that is distributed.
- We support the Tiger's Den food pantry. Items are collected year round. The last trip to deliver donated items took two full truck loads.
- In Advent we stuffed 100 stockings with items for people of all ages. Those were distributed to brighten the lives of people in need.
- We set a record in July with donations for gift cards for Veterans.
- We partnered again with Clarence High School and collected Bags of Cheer which were brought to nursing home residents in the area.
- We collected coats, hats, and gloves for the Depew Community Center.
- Cookies were decorated and packaged nicely and donated to the Main Transit Fire Department.
- The Creative Ministry group continues to make items which are donated to various people and places.
- At various points throughout the year donations are collected for Lutheran World Hunger and Disaster Relief.
- Bags of food and gift cards are available in the church office for those in need.
- In Lent our focus was on community organizations and the ways our congregation can help those around us. We heard presentations from Lutheran Charities, Buffalo Immigration Services, Hospice, and the Arc of Erie County.

The 2026 calendar is already coming into view with many of our routine efforts and new additions as well. Community Outreach remains a top priority at St. John. I became the chairman of the committee replacing our long-time chairman, Larry Schroeder. Also, four new members were added to cemetery committee to support our ongoing work and future endeavors. Breton Cemetery Services (BCS), who has performed our sales/interments of graves and has maintained the property, was sold to Nichols Cemetery Services. This was precipitated by the death of the long time owner of BSC, Bruce Breton. The company was purchase by Kyle Nichols who had been the long time foreman for BCS, so it was a very smooth transition.

Maintenance work includes the removal of several trees in danger of falling with a tree removal contractor, the patching of significant potholes in the paved roads, the filling of low areas of gravel roads. Nichols Cemetery Services continued their lawn mowing & the trimming of shrubs on the grounds. Repairs were made to the failing brickwork on the maintenance building office exterior, and a section of underground leaking water line was isolated and abandoned in place. Improvements made were the construction of a flagpole/flag on the grounds, the construction of trash can enclosures & the purchase on new trash receptacles, the planting of several new shrubs on the grounds, and the "staking out" of the area to become our Scattering Garden.

The cemetery investment funds that are managed by Courier Capital Co. performed very well, double digit ROI, during 2025. This performance is consistent with the performance of the major national economic indices. The committee met with our financial representative from Courier Capital during the fourth quarter of the year. Regarding our financial operations, revenues through grave sales and burials have been stable compared to the past several years. Expenses have also remained essentially fixed with no new major expenditures incurred.

PERSONNEL & MUTUAL MINISTRY

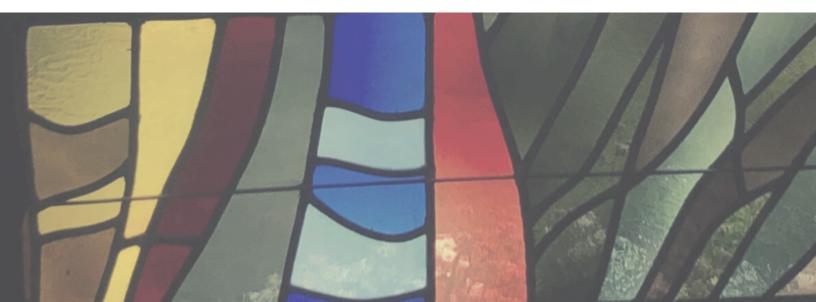

FINANCIAL MATTERS

PERMANENT ENDOWMENT

- As of 12/02/2025 the fund had a value of \$507,776.37.
- \$18,580 was withdrawn in 2025 as we anticipated.
- Net return for the fund was 13.69% YTD.

STEWARDSHIP

In December a stewardship letter and pledge card were emailed to the congregation. Pledges can be returned to the church office, worship plate, or made online @ www.sjlcamherst.com/pledge.

A more modest stewardship appeal was introduced this year in light of the ongoing capital campaign, Mission 200.

We anticipate \$275,000 in weekly giving in 2026. Up \$15,000 from 2025.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

- In the fall of 2025 we launched a three-year campaign to raise \$500,000.
- To date approximately \$320,000 has been pledged with gifts of over \$100,000 received.
- In 2026 three fundraisers will be held to help us achieve our goal.

- The intent of this campaign is to reduce debt and tackle capital projects outside the scope of our budget.
