Utilities in January look like they're under budget, but we likely overpaid in December. Insurance premiums are up in January, but much of the cost is annual premium. Mortgage payments are going well. Paying a lot towards the principal right now.

# Council Update - March

**The meeting began with prayer, standard business, and the pastor's report.**

Ginny and Scott discussed financial matters, clarifying that a previous \$2,000 donation to Feed More was not a new expense. Susan reported on her recent meeting with Pastor Scott and Pastor Marsha about community outreach efforts. She is developing a visual representation of all outreach activities and announced plans for a special hunger-focused collection starting with Palm Sunday, with quarterly outreach initiatives to follow. Susan also mentioned upcoming work on birthday meal and cake kits in collaboration with Pam.

## **Church Children Management and Events**

The meeting discussed the growing number of children attending church services, with Klansee noting the challenge of managing them and the need to address space constraints. Michelle offered assistance in managing the children, and the group discussed upcoming events including an egg hunt on Palm Sunday and First Communion in April. The worship and music update mentioned that Pastor Debi would be filling in for Pastor Scott on Sunday, and Scott noted that the stream quality needs improvement, with feedback to be given to Larry and Rick who are mentoring Peter.

## **Youth Room Renovation Progress Update**

The meeting covered updates across several areas. CJ reported that staff evaluations would be completed soon, with Michelle working on these alongside personnel and mutual ministry. Scott provided updates on youth activities, noting that 7 kids are preparing for their first communion and that youth room renovations are progressing well, with one room nearly complete and the second room advancing. Paul confirmed the focus has been on the youth room renovations, with one room finished and the second room making good progress. Michelle indicated mutual ministry work is in process, while stewardship had no updates to report, and finance updates were not available as Ken was unable to attend.

## **Summer Camp Discount and Parking**

The meeting covered several topics including Scott's upcoming absence and arrangements for continuing education tasks. The main decision was made to offer \$100 discounts for children attending LCLC summer camp, which was approved by the group. Scott also reminded attendees about parking arrangements for Easter Sunday and proper pew usage during services.

**The conversation ended with a prayer led by Scott.**

Sent \$3000 to the cemetery. So far \$320K/\$500K pledged for Mission 200. Received \$60K plus the \$20k for youth room. Mortgage was at \$240K, now down to \$160K after most recent payment. Scott thinks more has come in than the 80K. Looking to get work at OMC done in May

*We will be taking the summer off and starting up again in September. New ideas and new people are always welcome.*

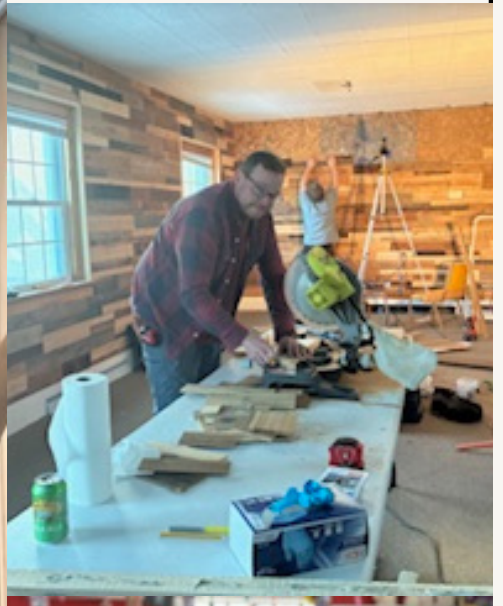

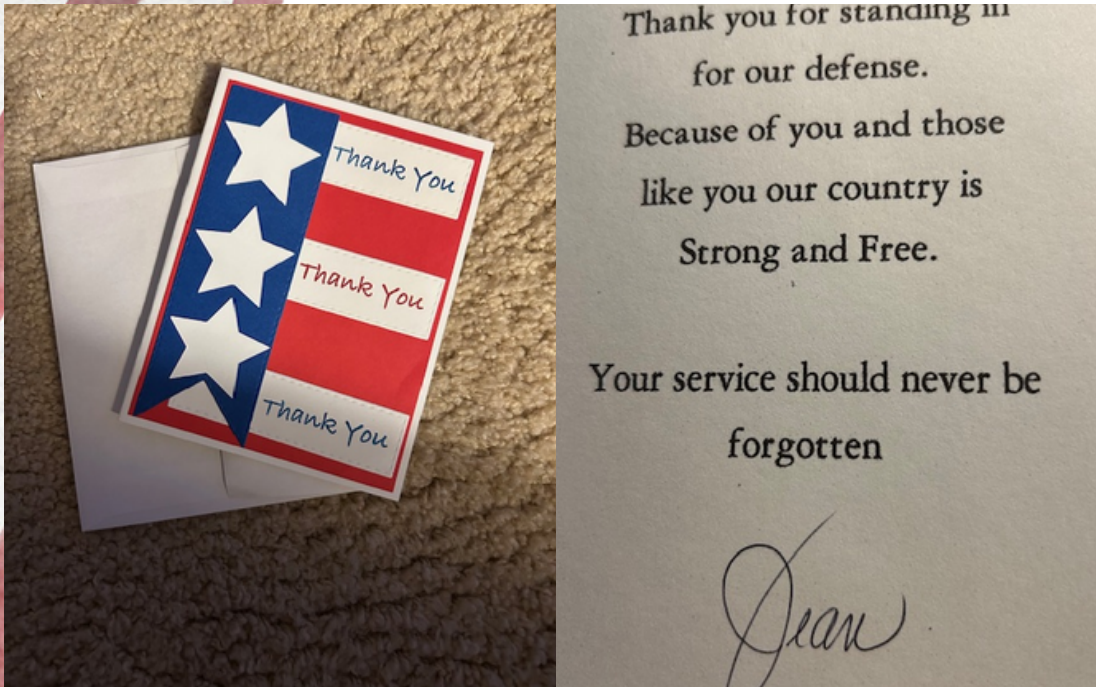
