Dear Friends,

The turning of the calendar has a way of inviting reflection. We look back on the year that has passed—with its joys and sorrows, its celebrations and losses—and we look ahead, wondering what the coming months will bring. A new year often tempts us to make promises: This year will be different. This year I'll do better. Scripture offers us a gentler and deeper word.

In the book of Lamentations, written in the midst of devastation and grief, we hear this surprising confession of hope:

“The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases,
His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning;
great is your faithfulness.” (Lamentations 3:22–23)

Notice what is new here. Not our resolve. Not our strength. Not our ability to fix what is broken. What is new—every morning, including this first morning of the year—is God's mercy.

As Lutherans, we confess that we live by grace alone. That means we enter this new year not by proving ourselves worthy of God's love, but by trusting a promise that has already been made and kept in Jesus Christ. In Christ, God has claimed us in baptism, forgiven us in mercy, and promised never to let us go. That promise did not expire on December 31, and it does not depend on how well we perform in the months ahead.

This does not mean the new year is meaningless. Quite the opposite. Because we are freed from having to justify ourselves, we are free to live—free to love our neighbors, free to serve, free to risk hope even when the future feels uncertain. We step into the new year carrying both our wounds and our gratitude, trusting that God meets us in both.

The coming year will likely hold moments of joy and moments of challenge. There will be times when faith feels strong and times when it feels fragile. Through it all, the church remains a place where we gather around Word and Sacrament, where we are reminded again and again who we are and whose we are.

So, as this new year begins, may we be gentle with ourselves and with one another. May we listen more closely, forgive more readily, and trust more deeply. And when the year feels long or heavy, may we remember this simple truth: God is already there—faithful, merciful, and making all things new in Christ.

Happy New Year. God's peace be with you in all that lies ahead.

Personnel – CJ - Routine Staff reviews for all Staff in January. Christmas gifts for the staff, including Alex.

Youth - Scott - Confirmation is being held. There was a special Halloween party. We had a flag football event with 30 kids from our congregation and others. Youth group continues to draw more and more kids. The youth participated in the stocking stuffer event.

Building and Grounds – Paul - Winterized the OMC and Outdoor bathroom. Front light updated to LED. Striped 6 additional parking spots. Electrical contractor coming tomorrow for switches in Sanctuary

Mutual Ministry – Met to discuss Pastor's Salary, recommendation made for budget

Cemetery – Ken - Several people willing to serve on the committee. Tom Brunner will be chairman. Kathy Brunner and Ken to share Treasurer position. Ken Motions to add new committee members; Lee seconds; All in favor. Motion passes.

Stewardship – I drafted a letter which will be mailed out this week to the congregation. The letter will include a pledge card. Folks may also pledge online at www.sjlcamerst.com/pledge. Mission 200 has nearly \$320,000 pledged.

Finance - Ken – No Report

Permanent endowment - Ken - No Report

Financial Secretary - Ginny - Remaining Benevolences need to be distributed. Pastor Irmer reached out to ask for some to go to feeding the hungry. Ginny asks for Heritage Christian Services. Already have given to Journey's End, the Arc, among others. \$1000 for Heritage; \$2000 for FeedMore WNY; Executive committee to distribute the rest by end of December.

2026 Budget - Proposed weekly budget to increase some, loose plate has been up too. Building use and Pancake breakfast remain about the same. Pastor 4% increase in Salary; Admin and Sexton 3% increase; youth pastor increase hours so increase salary. Much else remains the same. B&G increase to match cost increase. Adding Tech Support line item for Peter Smude internship. Confident that we'll have surplus again. Tabled discussion of what to do with surplus. Lee moved to present the budget to the congregation; Scott seconds; All in favor. Will send out next week.

\$318,000 has been pledged for Mission 200 so far. Received over \$100,000 of that this far. \$60,000 set aside from Mission 200 for early year expenses.

Meeting Adjourns: with the Lord's Prayer at 8:12: Susan moves; Ellen seconds, all in favor to adjourn



Mission 200

Dear Members & Friends of St. John,

In the fall of 2025, our congregation will embark upon an exciting endeavor to enhance our positive momentum and address our biggest needs. We are calling this effort “Mission 200: Our Faith, Legacy, & Future.” Mission 200 intends to honor our past and set us on a strategic path as we prepare for our 200th anniversary in 2033.

At St. John we have a rich history and a vibrant future. Our abundant story began with a faithful group of immigrants worshiping above a grocery store in the early 1800’s. In 1833 we incorporated, called a pastor, and built a church on Hickory Street. In the decades that followed we started a cemetery and an orphanage. We “birthed” enough congregations that we earned the nickname: “The mother church of Buffalo Lutheranism.” In the 1950’s we moved to Main St. in Amherst. In 1964, our beautiful sanctuary was completed. In 2002, we embarked upon a campaign to create the Gathering Space and address other capital improvements. Most recently, we constructed the Outdoor Ministry Center to improve our campus and create a worship and gathering area in the midst of God’s creation. These are the legacies of St. John.

As we prepare for our 200th anniversary, we rejoice in the renewed energy and growth at St. John. Our youth ministry and Sunday school continue to nourish families. Our Creative Ministry and Caring Hearts teams show the world God’s love. Our men’s ministry provides holy conversation, great breakfasts, and church improvements. Our worship services, including increased baptisms and celebrations, ground us in the Word. Simultaneously, our connections to the community continue to deepen in creative and life-giving ways.

To honor our past and capture the energy at St. John right now we are launching this campaign with the intention of capitalizing on our biggest opportunities and addressing our needs. We begin this ambitious endeavor trusting that our efforts will not just bless the church today but be a tremendous blessing to the future of St. John.

In short, Mission 200 seeks to raise \$500,000 with the intent to erase debt, provide restroom facilities and an altar at the OMC, refurbish the Youth Room, provide necessary Sanctuary improvements (including organ repair and improved lighting and sound), address capital improvements like the heating system, and much more. This is a three-year campaign. We hope that when the time comes you will be able to attend one of our gatherings where more information will be shared.

In the meantime, thank you for your faithfulness and generosity. Thank you for playing a role in this great story of God’s mission through St. John Lutheran Church. Mission 200 will not just honor our past; it will set our congregation up for a rich and vibrant future.
