# COVID-19 WORSHIP UPDATE

In March of 2020 we experienced what was for most of us an unprecedented disruption in our lives. Life shut down in most arenas. Events were canceled. Expectations were put on hold. Our worship was suspended and what we hoped would be a short hiatus became an arduous, anxious, stressful chapter in our lives.

In March of 2022 it appears as though there is hope for life to resume in new ways, for events to take place, and for previous years' expectations to be realized. Vaccinations, immunities, and much more knowledge regarding COVID have provided pathways for progress. The doors that were shut are once again open.

And so, I commend this Lenten season to you as an opportunity to reengage and reignite your spiritual life. The first scripture we hear in Lent comes from the prophet Joel. Joel writes, "Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love." (2:13)

## COUNCIL UPDATE

The February Church Council Meeting was held on February 15 at 7:00PM. The meeting was called to order at 7:02PM with all members present. The meeting began with a devotion from Psalm 19 and prayer. Once the agenda and prior month's minutes were approved, Pastor Hannon gave his report.

Pastor's report highlighted his ongoing ministry including chaplaincy, youth group, confirmation, worship leadership, pastoral care, pre-marital counseling, pastoral conversation, and administration. Pastor reported on three baptisms (Henry Graser, Leo Bogart, Rhea Barba) and one death (Ruth Bertini).

There was no report of the executive committee.

The committees offered the following reports:

**SOCIAL MINISTRY** – Our Lenten Challenge will be various forms of support to Haven House. A meeting has been called for 2.27.22 @ 9:30AM. A representative from Haven House will be at worship on 3.6.22 to address the congregation with the needs of their organization.

**FELLOWSHIP** – The 2nd Friday of the month soup luncheon was well received in February and will continue in Mary on the 11th from 11AM-1PM.

**WORSHIP & MUSIC** – We are back to in-person worship and are grateful for volunteers who are streaming the service to members still at home. Special thanks to Larry King and Rick Bosch for their time and technical support. We are transitioning towards a more familiar Lutheran service. We are encouraging congregational participation and singing.

**CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – Sunday School will resume on February 27th and run through May. Teachers are needed. A sign-up sheet is posted on the bulletin board outside of the sanctuary.

**YOUTH** – Confirmation is held monthly. Youth Night is held on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month. A Lock-In is set for the February break.

**BUILDING & GROUNDS** – We now contract routine boiler maintenance and service. The kitchen grease trap will be replaced.

**STEWARDSHIP** – A Lenten focus will be on World Hunger. An ice cream social to promote giving is being planned.

PERSONNEL – Jared Bulinski resigned his position to accept a full-time job.

**PERMANENT ENDOWMENT** – The fund balance ended approximately \$566,000. The 2021 return rate was 14%.

**FINANCE** – January giving was low presumably because of the lack of in-person worship. Expenses currently exceed revenue by \$4,500. Brian Hirschey will begin to assist with financial contract management and insurance. In the business portion of the meeting the Church Council approved the charter of Cub Scout Troop 457. The biennial Rummage Sale has been set for June 4, 2022. Materials may be brought in at any time between now and then.

The meeting ended with the sharing of prayer concerns and Lord's Prayer at 7:50PM.
