COUNCIL UPDATE

The April Council meeting was held on the 19th at 7:00 PM. The meeting began with scripture and prayer. After the minutes were approved and the agenda adopted, Pastor gave his report. Pastor reported on the many happenings at St. John including youth nights, an Easter egg hunt, and the fundraiser for Ukraine. Pastor noted that in-person worship attendance has been steadily increasing. Pastor Scott presided at a committal at our cemetery last month and supply preached at Amherst Lutheran because they are without a called pastor. Finally, Pastor shared that his grandfather had passed and that Pastor Greene would be covering pastoral care items for a couple of days while Pastor Scott spends time with family.

The committees offered the following reports...

Social Ministry – We are wrapping up our collection for Haven House the week after Easter.

Fellowship – A new women's lunch group is starting in May. We are resuming our luncheons in the park in May as well (location TBD).

Worship and Music – The committee met and affirmed what has been working in our worship. We hope to increase congregational singing and have some ideas to help facilitate that. We will worship at 8:30 & 10:30 through May and return to one service at 9:30 for the summer months. We approved spending \$2,000 on equipment to help live stream worship (we have been borrowing cameras, cables, etc. from Larry King – thank you, Larry!). We require more sound and video volunteers to lighten the burden placed on a few people.

Personnel – Brittany Grawbowski has started her work in the position of the sexton.

Christian Education – Sunday School will continue for the next few weeks culminating with a Sunday Funday on May 22nd. Many thanks to those who've stepped up to teach recently including Kate Hannon and Molly Ullrich.

Youth – Middle School youth continue to meet on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month.

Building and Grounds – a Boy Scout clean-up day is scheduled for May 8th.

Finance – Money was sent and received by the bunker in Ukraine. The finances, both income and expenses, are on track with the budget. Our 2023 envelopes have been purchased.

Mutual Ministry – The committee met to address some concerns and stress factors that have emerged as we continue to 'rebuild' after two+ years of the pandemic. We encouraged transparency, honesty, Christian love, and increased communication as we move forward. We hope the Council and committees will redouble their efforts as we venture forward.

Permanent Endowment – Our management fee has been reduced to 0.40%. A withdrawal of up to \$100,000 has been approved for the construction of the Outdoor Ministry Center.

In the business portion of the meeting, it was noted that the Boy Scout Pancake Breakfast is scheduled for May 1st 8 AMnoon.

The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer.
