Mortgage Fund

To construct the Outdoor Ministry Center our congregation took out a mortgage of \$250,000.

The loan has a variable interest rate that will (likely) increase in 4.5 years.

To assist with monthly payments and accelerate the payoff of the loan we have created a "mortgage fund."

We are asking each family to prayerfully consider if you can support this effort. Our current goal is to raise enough money to completely cover the cost of the monthly payments in 2024.

If you are in a position to help, the cost of a monthly mortgage payment is \$1,300. To assist with half a month it is \$650. And a quarter of a month is \$325. COUNCIL UPDATE - SEPTEMBER

The meeting began with prayer from Pastor. After the agenda and minutes were approved, Pastor and the committees offered their reports.

Pastor Scott summarized his monthly ministry, including pastoral acts.

Social Ministry noted fall happenings including another year of Bags of Cheer.

Fellowship noted plans for the upcoming Tailgate Church when the Bills' play at 9:30AM on Sunday, October 8th. The Men's Ministry continues to meet on Saturday mornings.

Worship & Music met and proposed a new arrangement with Cindy Lin for her to accompany the 8:30AM service in addition to her responsibilities for the 10:30AM service. The committee continued to discuss live-streaming and the best approach moving forward.

We continue to seek a Youth Director. The few leads we pursued did not pan out.

Christian Education noted the ongoing need for teachers.

Building & Grounds reported on boiler maintenance & paint recycling.

The **financial report** indicated that we currently have a revenue over expenses thanks in large part to faithful giving. Thank you St. John! The car show made \$3,000 in profit for the OMC. The congregation donated over \$4,000 for Disaster Relief. Again, thank you St. John!

In the business portion of the meeting the OMC was discussed. We will pursue a new plan for th altar and require a plan to reduce the mortgage as quickly as possible.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.



COUNCIL UPDATE - OCTOBER

Pastor Scott led the meeting off with devotions. Once the agenda and minutes were approved, Pastor gave his report. He noted 4 baptisms in the past few weeks and the increasing need for pastoral conversation with members and friends of the church as many people are struggling with grief and life in this world.

The committees offered the following reports:

Social Ministry - we hope to partner with Sleep in Heavenly Peace for an Angel Tree Project. We are looking for a volunteer to help deliver our collected food to the food pantry. We are collecting Bags of Cheer.

Fellowship - Tailgate Church was a success. A chili cook-off will once again be held this year.

Worship & Music - Cindy Lin is now our Music Director and accompanies both services in a new arrangement coordinated with Pastor Scott & the Praise Band.

Christian Education - approximately 10 children have been attending.

Youth - new day, same story. Confirmation will resume on November 5th at 11:30AM.

Finance - our primary insurance company has merged with another one of our insurance companies. Brian Hirschey is looking into what benefits this might have for St. John.

Stewardship - a meeting has been called to get the Stewardship appeal moving.

Cemetery - prayers for the Breton family as they mourn the death of Bruce. Bruce has managed our cemetery service for decades (the Breton family for over 100 years). St. John has been assured that business will continue as usual.

Finance - our revenue over expenses dropped by \$15,000 over the month. We hope giving will rebound as we close the fiscal year. A motion was made and approved to send \$2,500 to the Lutheran Church of Jordan and the Holy Land.

In the business portion of the meeting the council set the date of our annual meeting for December 10th at 9:30AM. At this meeting, ministry will be reviewed, new council members elected, and a 2024 budget will be passed.

The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

Five of our confirmation youth attended a class on the sacrament of Baptism and then witnessed the Baptism of Owen Walsh.

PRAYER



The Creative Ministry group certainly has been busy this fall. We meet the 2nd Wednesday of each month from 10:00 until about noon. Our most recent project has been to make and fill blessing bags to donate. This project was completed through a Thrivent grant submitted by Jane D'Agostino. Supplies to make drawstring bags and items to fill them were purchased with with the funds. Each bag was filled with a variety of personal care items and 2 pairs of socks. In October twenty-four bags were delivered to Compass House, a shelter for homeless teens in the Buffalo area.

Our current project is making port pillows and drain pockets for patients at Roswell. The port pillows are attached to car seatbelts to protect permanent chemo ports patients have for ongoing treatments. The drain pockets are given to mastectomy patients to use after surgery. Most patients go home with one or possibly two drains to take care of and these pockets are a help. At this time 120 of these items are a work in progress and will be delivered soon.

On December 13th we will have guest speakers talk to us about Wings Flights of Hope. This organization flies patients and their families to other cities to receive medical care that may not be available for them in WNY. The pilots are volunteers and this service is free of charge to patients and their family. It will be interesting to hear more about this wonderful organization. Judy and Dave Nitchke shared information about this group after chatting with them at Erie County Fair. I have had several former students get transportation to NYC through Wings. Our group will be making "blessing bags" to be given to various patients. The bags will contain handy items to have on hand as well as puzzle books, etc. For more information check out their website, www.wingsflight.org.

Also, if you are interested in coming to hear the talk by one of the pilots contact me for more information.

Future projects planned are clothing protectors and glasses cases for local nursing homes. Lap blankets are available those hospitalized or on the prayer list. New ideas for things to make and donate are always welcome.
